A2

HEALTH INSURANCE



Proof of health insurance is mandatory for enrolment. You have several options to proof it:

Option 1: European Students with EHIC (European Health Insurance Card). For EU-students only !

Option 2: German public health insurance

It costs approximately 80 € per month (standard price for all students from all health insurance companies). You will have the opportunity to buy it during the enrolment period at the Express- Service.

Option 3: German private health insurance

Students from non-EU countries or students who cannot provide the EHIC (European Health Insurance Card) can purchase a German private health insurance, e. g. MAWISTA, a special private health insurance for exchange students. The monthly prime is 35 € - 75 €, depending on the coverage. <u>More information at mawista.com</u>.

IMPORTANT: In most cases a Health Insurance from the home country alone is not sufficient to be enrolled. Students need to get the authorization of a German public health insurance provider. Important: To get this authorization, you need a <u>copy of your benefit plan and your insurance contract</u>.
